### 3. Meetings / Operational Initiatives:

4. Attended the Greenville County Fire Chiefs' Association monthly meeting.
- Attended a Radio Procedures committee meeting to develop countywide interoperability for the county's new radio system.
- Attended a Northern Greenville County Automatic Aid Council meeting. This meeting is to develop new and ongoing relationships with the northern Greenville County fire departments to work jointly on policies, procedures, responses, and use of shared data for improved responses.
- Attended the South Carolina Fire Service Legislative Day in Columbia.



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### **Meetings / Operational Initiatives (Continued):**

- Switched over to ESO ePCR (Patient Care Reporting) as part of a countywide effort to consolidate prehospital patient care reports to derive outcomes on patient encounters.
- Met with Dr. Martin Lutz (Greenville County EMS Medical Director) reference our ALS QRV program and to obtain signatures required to renew our various licenses.
- Met with a vendor in reference to installing security cameras at headquarters and Beaver Dam to document visitors or trespassers on property.
- Taught one EMT Continuing Education class for department and other agency personnel.
- Continued working with our IT Vendor (Rocketwise) to coordinate a change to Charter Spectrum internet and new VoIP phone system. Changeover to Charter-Spectrum was made on April 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Participated in a Community meeting with residents of Cliffs Mountain Park in reference to our capabilities to respond to fire and medical emergencies and our partnership with Slater-Marietta Fire District to respond automatically to any property in CMP for structural fires. This meeting resulted in approximately 15 persons signing up for CPR and/or First Aid classes.
- The average Turnout time was 01:30. Full report of turnout time per apparatus is attached.
