* There was one structure fire in the district in February. The second building fire was in Tigerville's fire district. This number represents Glassy personnel on scene. Lake Cunningham, Gowensville, and Tigerville also responded staff and apparatus totaling more than 20 persons on scene during the event.

Glassy Mountain provided 28 Mutual Aid responses in February. One was for a Building Fire, one was for a Smoke Scare, five were for Motor Vehicle Accidents, and one was to assist a Law Enforcement Agency. The remaining 20 were medical responses as a GCEMS QRV. Ten of those were cancelled enroute to the alarm.

2. Personnel:

- Received one resignation of a full time employee to part time status.



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3. Meetings / Operational Initiatives:

- Attended the Greenville County Fire Chiefs' Association monthly meeting.
- Taught two CPR classes to Cliffs personnel from all three communities.
- Met with Chief Ashmore from Landrum Fire Rescue in reference to formalizing an Automatic Aid agreement.
- Attended the Annual EMS Today Conference and Exposition in National Harbor, MD.
- Attended a GCEMS Paramedic Continuing Education Program class offering.
- Completed Annual Physicals for Interior Certified personnel.
- The average Turnout time was 01:28. Two times in this average 80:16 and 10:13 for apparatus that were second-due to an alarm. The new CAD system does track per-unit times but the Alarm to Response time does not take into account secondary units, therefore the initial alarm time is used as a base. Excluding those outliers, the average time was 1:00. Full report of turnout time per apparatus is attached.

4. Inspections / Re-Inspections / Preplans and Plan Reviews:

- Twelve inspections and two Building Plan reviews were completed in February.
