- River Falls; for a motor vehicle accident and a reported unauthorized controlled burn.
- Lake Cunningham for a medical emergency which was cancelled en route.
- Tigerville for an alarm activation.
- Green River (NC) to assist with a lost hiker.



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2. **Personnel:**

- Received one volunteer application. We received a resignation from Engineer/EMT Nick Adams who will be pursuing a career with Greenville County EMS. Firefighter Adams will remain with the department as a part time employee.

3. **Meetings / Operational Initiatives:**

- Provided EMT continuing education to department and neighboring agency EMTs.
- Attended a South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) Fusion Liaison Officer orientation program. The liaison program trains members in fire and EMS agencies to spot and be notified of suspicious activity and potential trends of crimes in South Carolina. This was the second class required in a series of training for Fusion Liaison Officers.
- The average Turnout time was 00:51. The Incident Response Detail Times report is attached for your review.

4. **Inspections / Re-Inspections / Preplans and Plan Reviews:**

- There were no inspections completed in August. Several were conducted but not completed as the inspectors are awaiting corrections to complete the inspections.
