* This includes responses in district and mutual aid to Gowensville and Slater-Marietta. This calculation also includes the total time from notification to location of the fire on Glassy mountain which was 36:18.

** Ten personnel responded for the structure fire in Gowensville. Nineteen personnel responded for the Brush fire on Glassy Mountain.

Glassy Mountain provided 9 Mutual Aid responses in January. One was for a building fire in Gowensville. Two were for brush fires in Gowensville and Slater-Marietta. Four were for medical emergencies outside the district. The remaining two were for a fire alarm in Tigerville and a passenger vehicle fire with River Falls Fire Department.



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2. **Personnel:**

- Hired one part time paramedic.

- Connor Christie completed his National Registry certification as an EMT.

3. **Meetings / Operational Initiatives:**

- Provided EMT Continuing Education training and conducted EMT skills verification and review.
- Met with the Greenville County EMS Medical Director to discuss ALS fire departments' role in the system and program development of other agencies that desire to advance to the ALS level.
- Attended Paramedic Continuing Education on Advanced Airway skills.
